## Site Progress

### MAIN BUILDING



The roof is now in place and the decorative strips are being added. On the roof the natural ventilators and man safe system (health and safety requirement) have been fitted.



Work has now started internally and on the ground floor stud partitions are being built and boarded on one side to allow for the first fix of gas and electricity. On the first floor under floor heating has been installed.

## EXTERNAL WORKS



(BMX Track)

Work commenced week commencing the 4<sup>th</sup> April to build the retaining structure at the southern end of the BMX Track. Once this is completed the subcontractor can come back on site to complete the Track. The acoustic barrier/seating area has been altered to incorporate a large quantity of surplus soil from the site and these designs are being tested for suitability.

## PARKFIELD HOUSE

The details of the work for Parkfield House have been agreed and asbestos reports will be completed week commencing the 11<sup>th</sup> April.
